FAM description:

This tour takes in the natural beauty of both Central and Eastern Newfoundland and Labrador, including Iceberg Alley, with opportunities for whale watching, iceberg viewing, and bird watching.

This tour begins in Gander once known as The Crossroads of the World in the pioneering days of air travel. From here you'll journey to the Iceberg Capital of World, Twillingate, where you'll get to know the locals, watch for icebergs and whales, and enjoy culinary feasts from the sea. Then it's off to historic Bonavista Peninsula, where you'll enjoy a whale watching tour, encounter some puffins, visit historical sites, explore the charming village of Trinity, and take in the beauty of this peninsula's dramatic coastline. Before you leave, visit Terra Nova National Park for a quick scenic hike, or peruse the new interpretation centre.

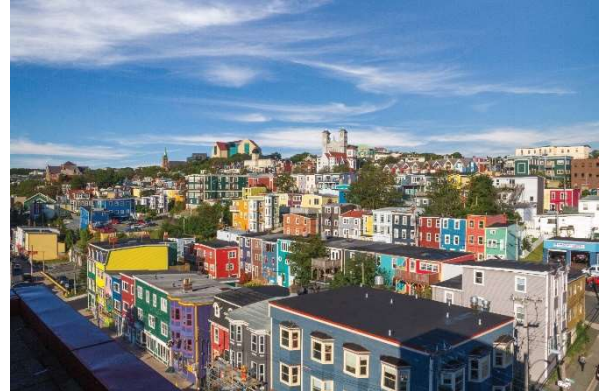
Newfoundland and Labrador's spring daytime temperatures range between 11- 15°C with lows of 2-6°C

Staggering Landscapes and Viking History

FAM description:	<p>Explore the unique natural wonders of Western Newfoundland and Labrador - take a walk on the Earth's mantle and sail through a freshwater fjord - and learn about how the Vikings reached our shores over 1,000 years ago.</p> <p>This journey on the Viking Trail starts in Gros Morne National Park UNESCO World Heritage Site, with a walk on the Earth's mantle at the Tablelands, followed by some time exploring the park as well as soaking up some live music, dining, and visiting the new Gros Morne Inn boutique hotel. On tour, you'll see Gros Morne National Park through the eyes of the Indigenous peoples and you'll also sail through the dramatic fjord at Western Brook Pond. There are plenty of opportunities for hikes and viewpoint stops! Further along the Viking Trail, you'll have opportunity to take a whale and iceberg watching boat tour, visit the Viking settlement at L'Anse aux Meadows, and pause to take in the natural coastal beauty at Arches Provincial Park. You'll enjoy fresh seafood and traditional dishes along the way, and even visit a new craft brewery.</p>

Experience Vibrant St. John's and the Baccalieu Coastal Drive

FAM description: The capital, St. John's, is home to a vibrant nightlife, amazing food, and the bright houses of Jellybean Row. The port city is a charming mix of old and new - and you don't have to go far to experience the rugged coastal charm of rural Newfoundland and Labrador, on the Irish Loop and the Baccalieu Coastal Drive.

On this tour you'll explore colourful, vibrant St. John's, the capital city of Newfoundland and Labrador and one of the oldest cities in Canada. You'll visit historical attractions like Cabot Tower atop Signal Hill National Historic Site - site of the first Trans-Atlantic wireless signal - as well as Cape Spear National Historic Site, the most easterly point in North America. Pause for photos at Jellybean Row with its rainbow assortment of Victorian homes, enjoy some fine dining, and spend time wandering Quidi Vidi Village (where you'll sample some iceberg beer!). You'll also spend a day exploring the Irish Loop, with a whale and birdwatching tour and a lighthouse picnic lunch in Ferryland. Finally, experience the Baccalieu Coastal Drive with a visit to Doctor's House Inn and Spa, as well as Cupids, where its legacy goes beyond the history of Canada's first English settlement. Top off the experience with a fun night of live music and entertainment in downtown St. John's!
