

Life on the Floe Edge



Dates: **Post tour**
May 28 to June 4, 2022

Hosted by: Destination Nunavut / Arctic Bay Adventures

Location: Nunavut

FAM description: Experience a destination that few ever have the chance to explore: the floe edge of Admiralty Inlet, at the north end of Baffin Island in Canada's arctic. Spring and summer are fleeting in this land of mountains and fiords, but during this brief window wondrous life abounds in the 24-hour sun.

The Floe Edge is truly remarkable experience, where each year over a small 3-4 week period, we have a chance to see some species which are normally found far in the Arctic Ocean. At this time of the year, we have the migration of both Walrus and Beluga Whales, so these are two of the species we will be looking for. Taking the lead from our local Inuit guides we follow the Floe Edge for days of discovery, possible narwhal watching and the chance to see a variety of sea birds, polar bears, seals and possibly beluga and bowhead whales. Since we will experience close to 24 hours of sun at this time of the year; there will be long full days looking to find and photograph animals perfectly adapted to survive in this challenging environment.

Please note: While this adventure is not overly strenuous, participants must be of "fair" physical fitness. (e.g. must be able to walk on uneven terrain, endure outdoor conditions)

Please expect 2hrs – 3hrs per day traveling on ice on qamutik sleds

Limited cellular phone service in parts of the tour. Only cell phone coverage is in the town of Arctic Bay

Some accommodation will be in tents

Venture deeper into the landscape on a sensational snowmobile excursion. Build an igloo and savour a cup of hot tea inside. Perhaps you'll see the Northern Lights dance in waves of green across an inky sky, or witness the dawn of a new spring under 20 hours of daylight? You have left behind the well-trodden path, you're on a Bucket List adventure.
